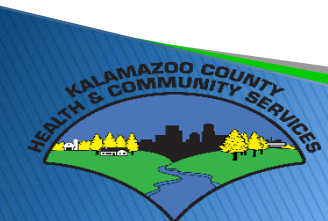

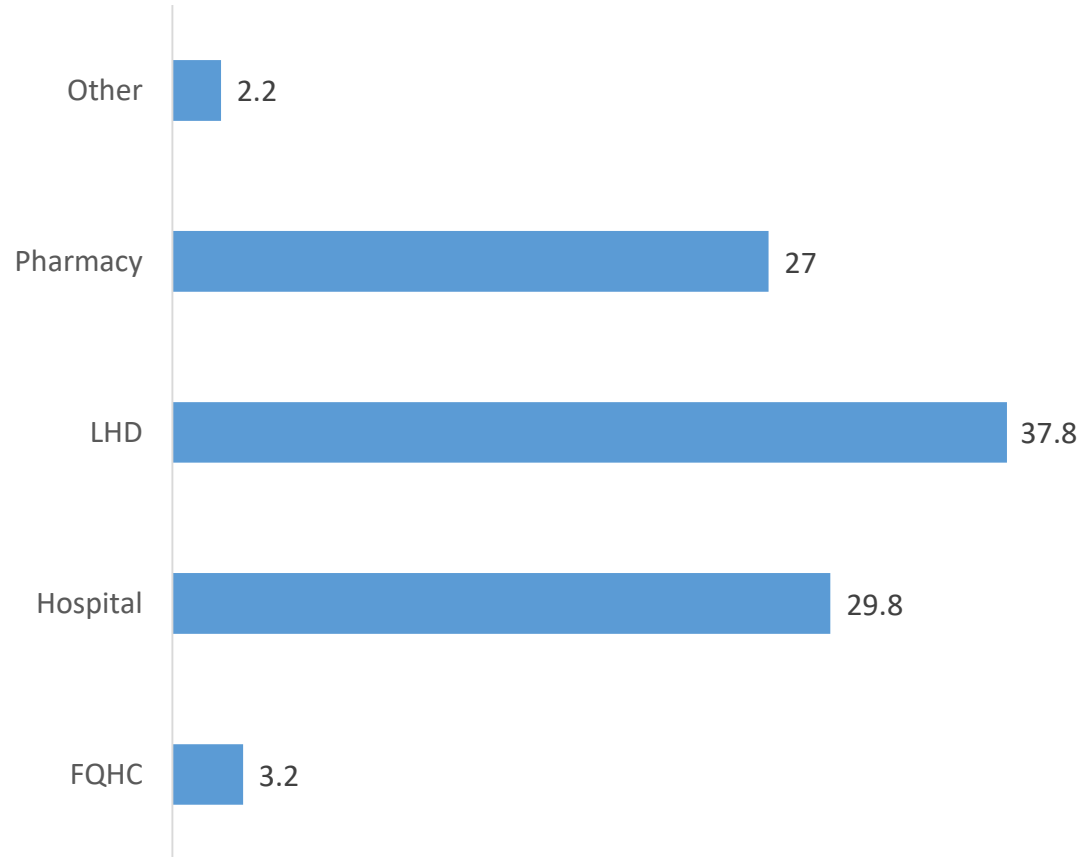

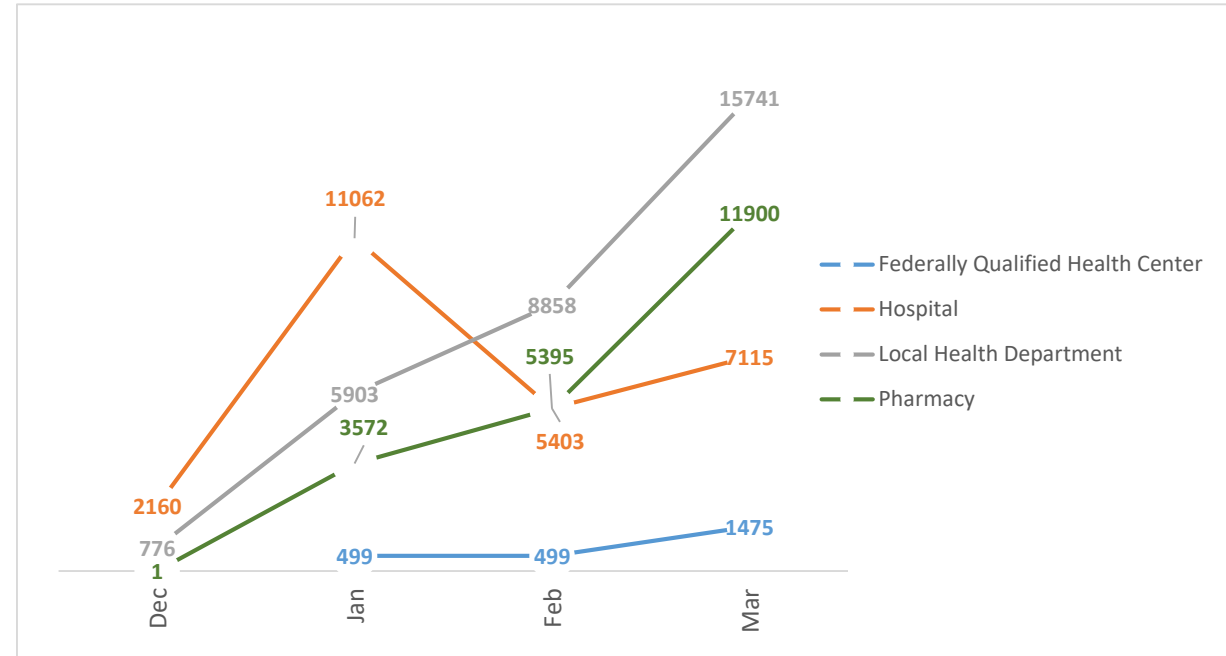


# Kalamazoo County Residents: First Doses Administered by Facility Type

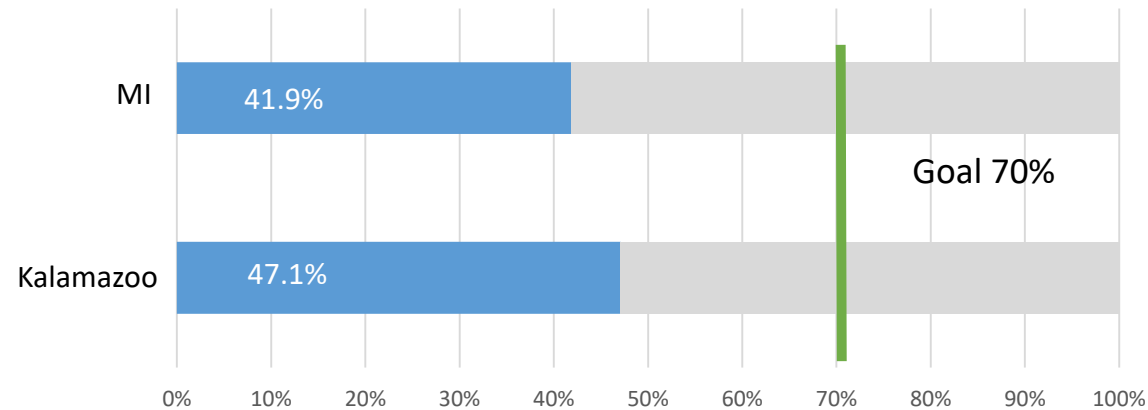

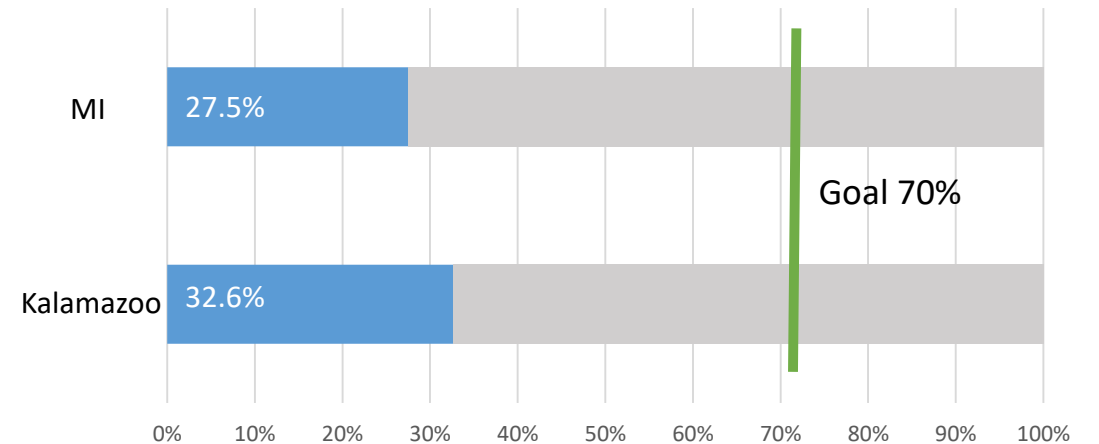

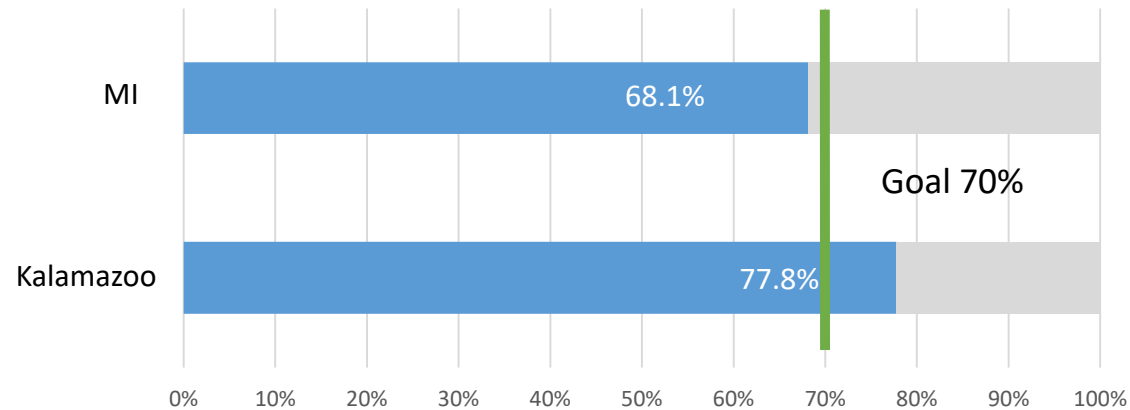




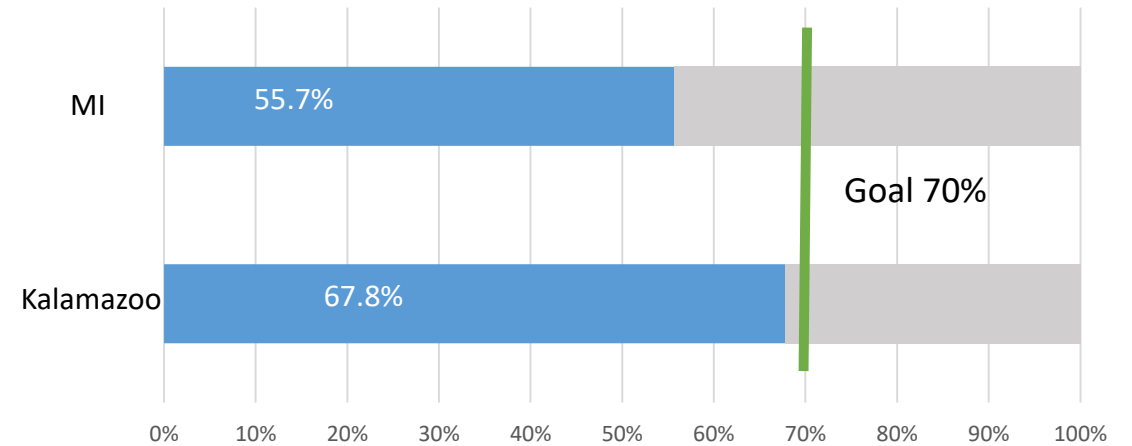

(Age 65+) That Has Completed the Series



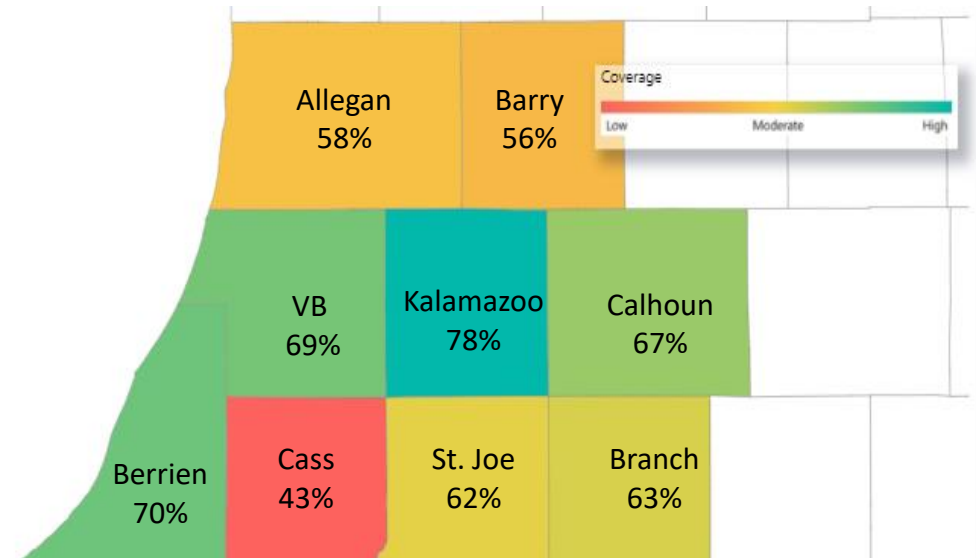
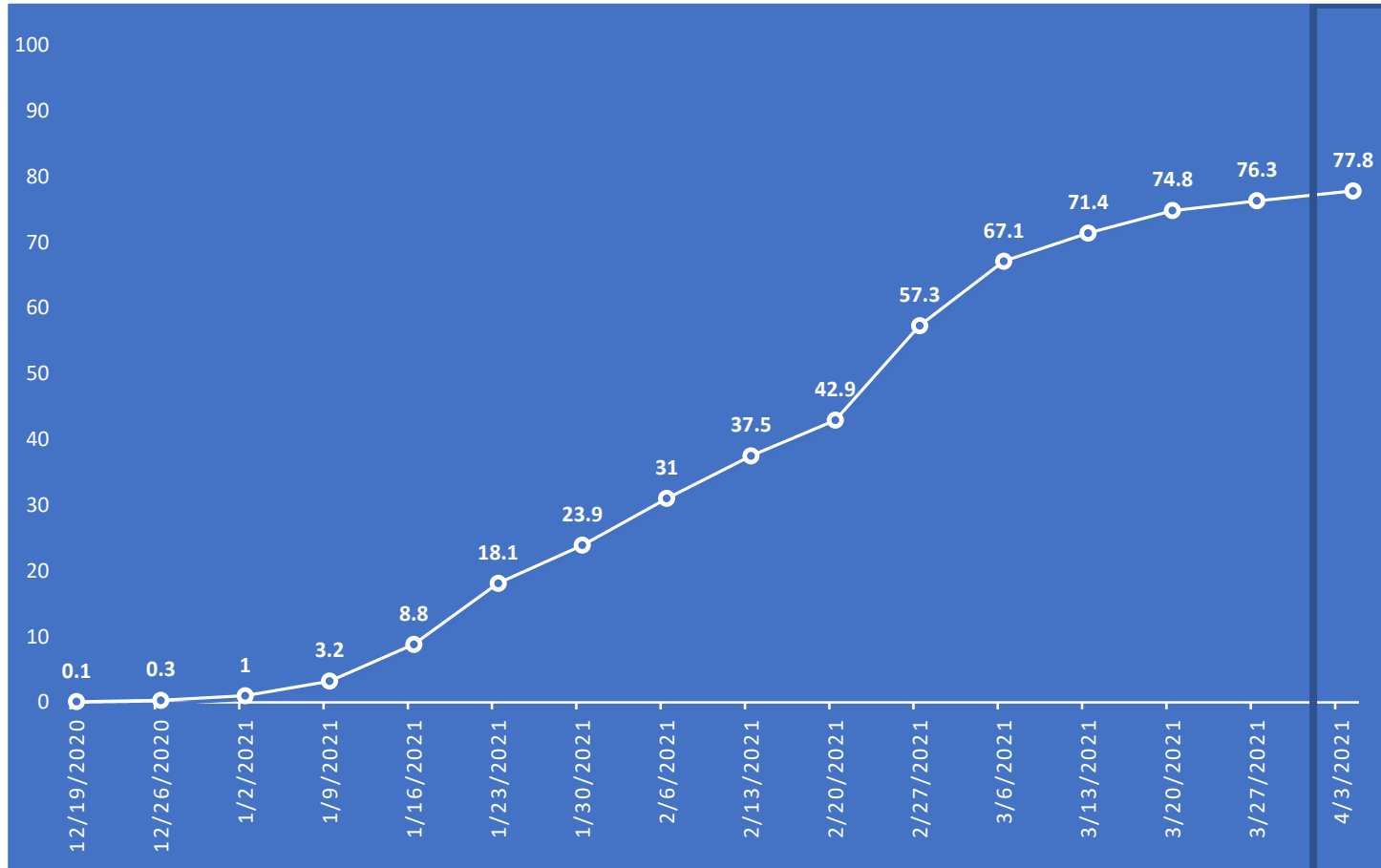

# Age 65+ Cumulative Vaccination Coverage (Initiation)



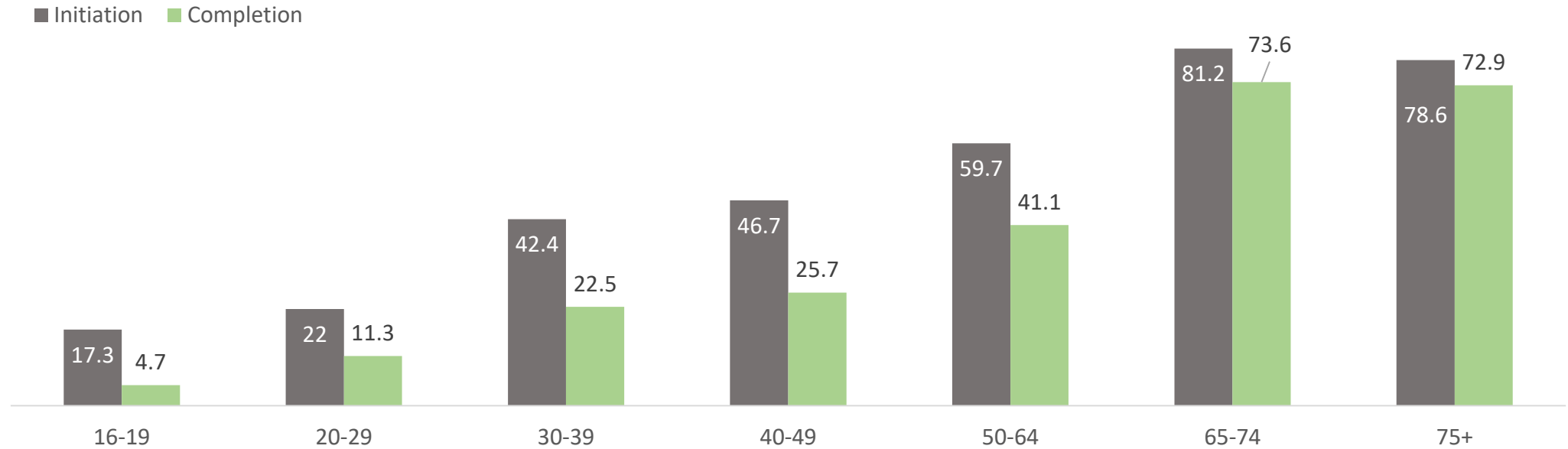

# Programming Update

- Traditional Services; 2020 Review:
  - **Individuals Served CM:** 430 individuals = 10% Increase
  - **Hours:** Respite & Personal Care 23,344 Hours = 20% increase
  - **Hours:** Homemaking 19,990 Hours = 24% increase
  - **Miles:** 17,034 Miles of assisted transportation = 26% increase
- 2020 Trends:
  - Higher level of need for new & current enrollments
  - Higher interest in preventative services (homemaking)
  - Increased support to Caregivers (respite services)





# Programming Update

- Expanded Services, 2021 Planning:
  - Serving Priority 3
    - Increasing availability of homemaking/preventative services
    - Updated enrollment procedure specific to P3: Quicker enrollment and turnaround time
- AASA: No Wrong Door Initiative
  - Decrease isolation
  - I&A, Outreach, Access to Services – coordination with regional AAA's.
- AASA: Vaccine Support
  - On the state level AAA's are receiving funding to provide vaccine support.
