

SPECIAL INFORMATION REGARDING THE MAY 5, 2020 SPECIAL ELECTION

The May 5, 2020 Special Election will be held as an all-mail election, and as such, there are several changes in the way the election will be conducted.

- All registered voters in the KRESA district will receive an application for an absentee ballot from the Secretary of State. Included with the application [AV application](#) and a letter [Letter](#) explaining the procedures to apply for an absentee ballot, as well as a postage paid envelope to return your completed application to your city or township clerk.
- Please note that the application can be mailed or e-mailed to your city or township clerk. It does need to be signed.
- You will then receive a ballot for the May 5 election in the mail, which can be returned to your local clerk in a postage paid envelope. Please note that the postage paid envelopes are unique to the May 5 election, and will not be used in any future elections.
- It is important to remember that all absentee ballots must be received by your local clerk no later than the close of polls (8:00 p.m.) on May 5.
- There will be NO regular precincts open on May 5. All ballots cast will be “absentee”. Your city or township clerk’s office will be open for 8 hours on either Saturday or Sunday prior to the election and also on Election Day for AV ballots and to register to vote.
- Please remember that during the COVID-19 crisis, most, if not all local city and township offices are closed. Many will have drop boxes available, but not all. Mail or e-mail (in the case of an application form) is the best way to obtain and return a ballot.
