

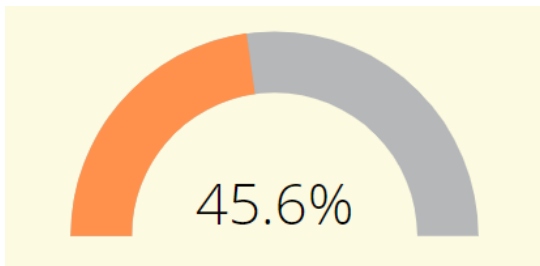
Data Update

Influenza – Current Vaccination Rates

Nov. 2021

County Vaccination Goal

The vaccination goal for the state of Michigan is to administer 4 million doses of influenza vaccine. The Kalamazoo County goal is 123,042 doses administered to county residents. During the past 2020-21 Flu Season, a total of 108,155 doses of vaccine were administered to Kalamazoo County residents.

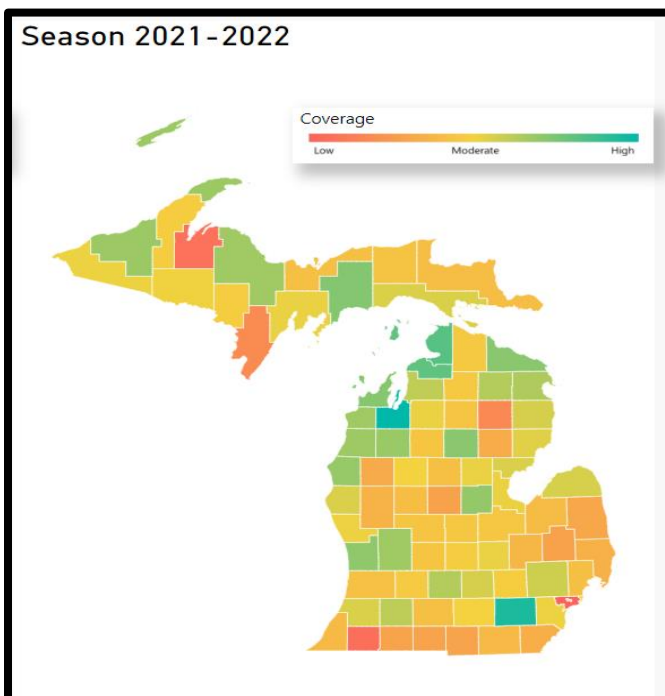

Current Coverage Rates by County

The map below shows the current vaccination coverage rate by county, a darker green color indicates a higher vaccination rate. These rates are based on the county population age 6 months or older. **Kalamazoo County is currently at 21%.** The highest county vaccination rate in the state is Grand Traverse County (29.6%) followed by Washtenaw County at 28% (see table below). 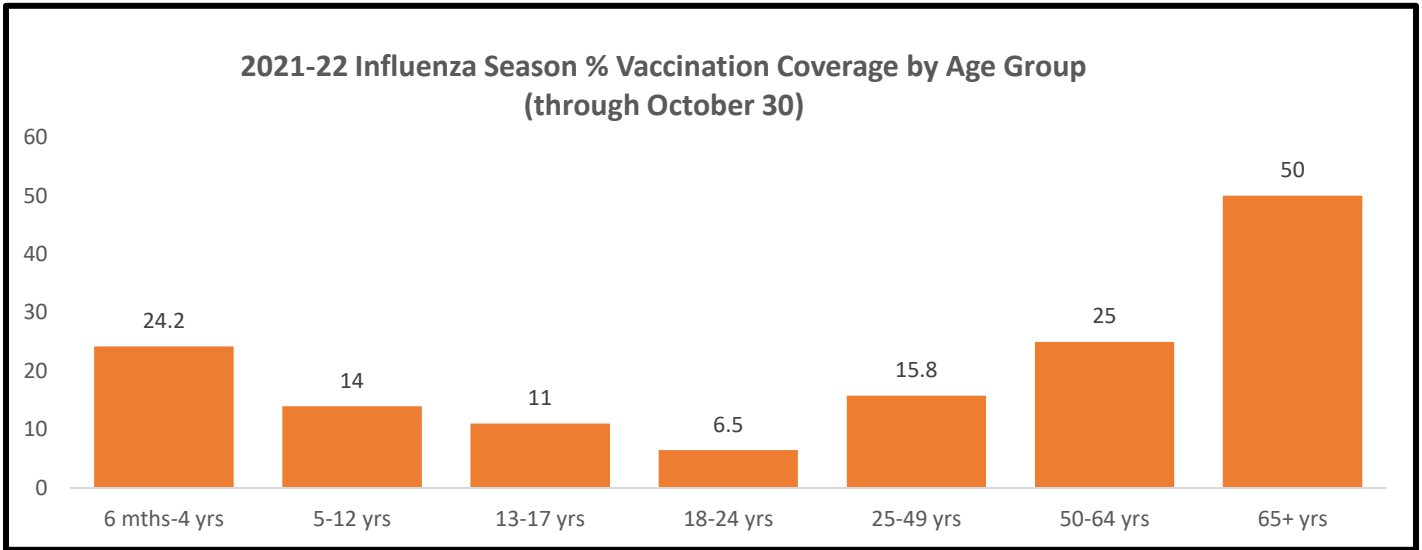

Current Coverage by Age Group

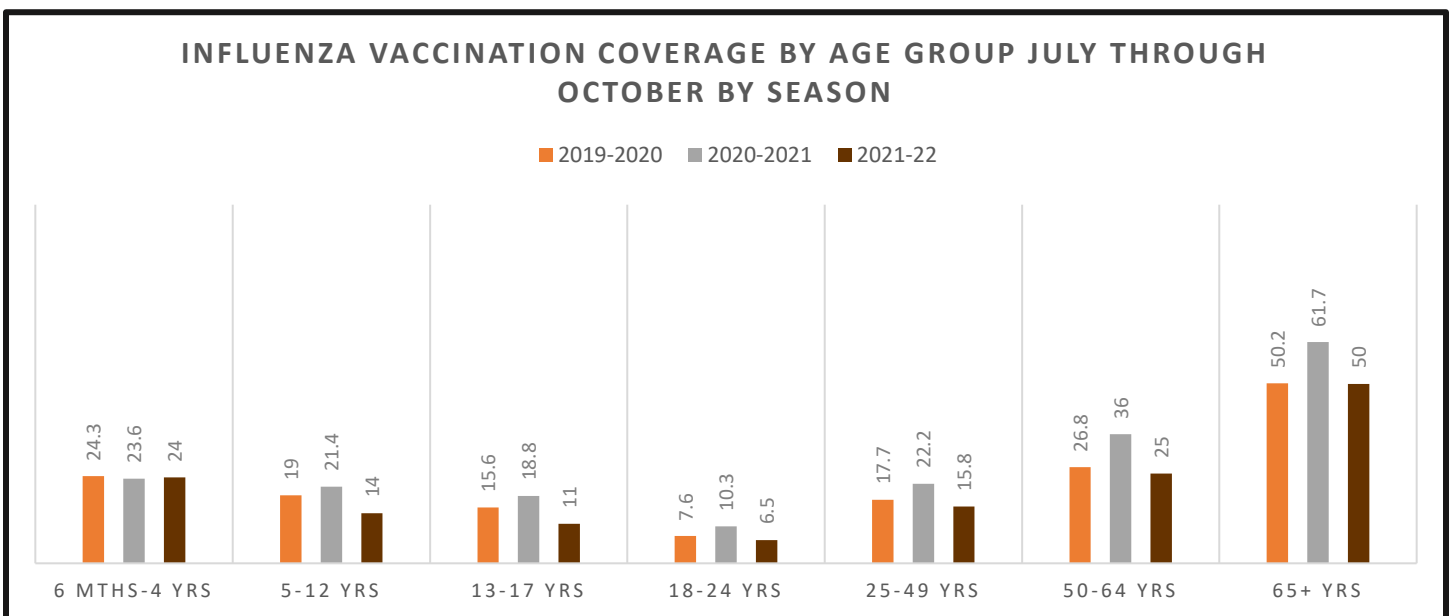
For the current 2021-22 Influenza Season, the Kalamazoo County coverage rate is highest among those age 65+ (50%) followed by the 50-64 (25%) and 6 mths-4 yr (24%) age groups. The lowest coverage rate is in the 18-24 year group (6.5%).

Coverage by Age Group by Season to Date (July-October)

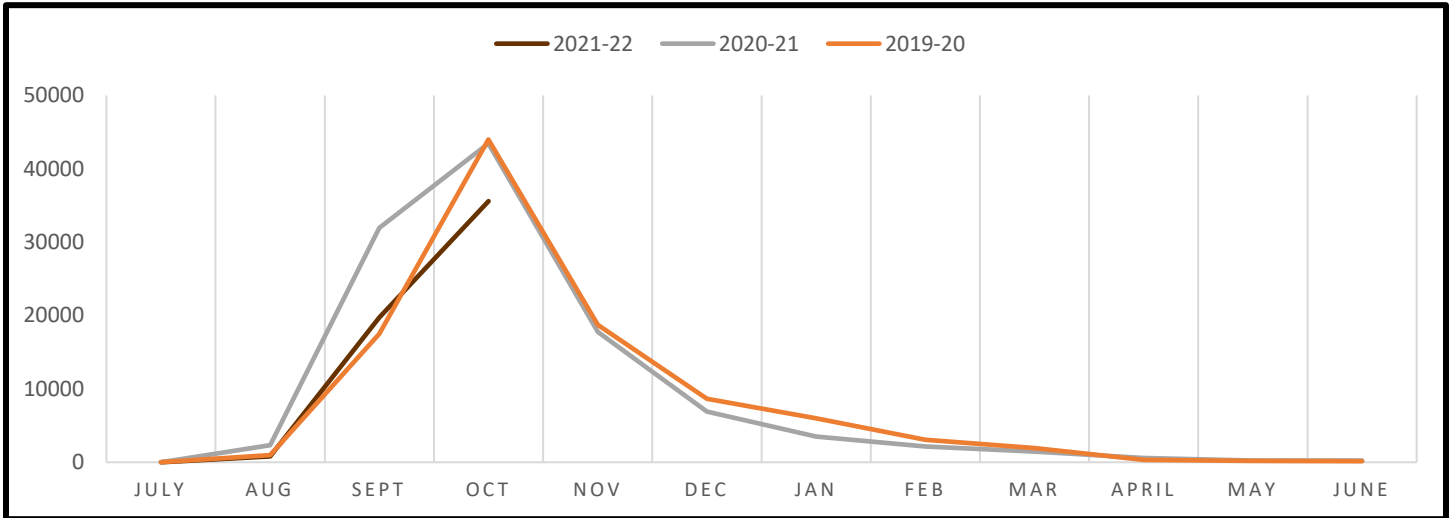
The current coverage rate is similar to the previous two seasons for children age 6mths-4 years (~24%). All other age groups had higher vaccination coverage rates by October during the past flu season (2020-21). The 5-64 year age groups are currently at lower vaccination rates compared to the past two flu seasons (2020-21 and 2019-20).

Administration Trends by Season

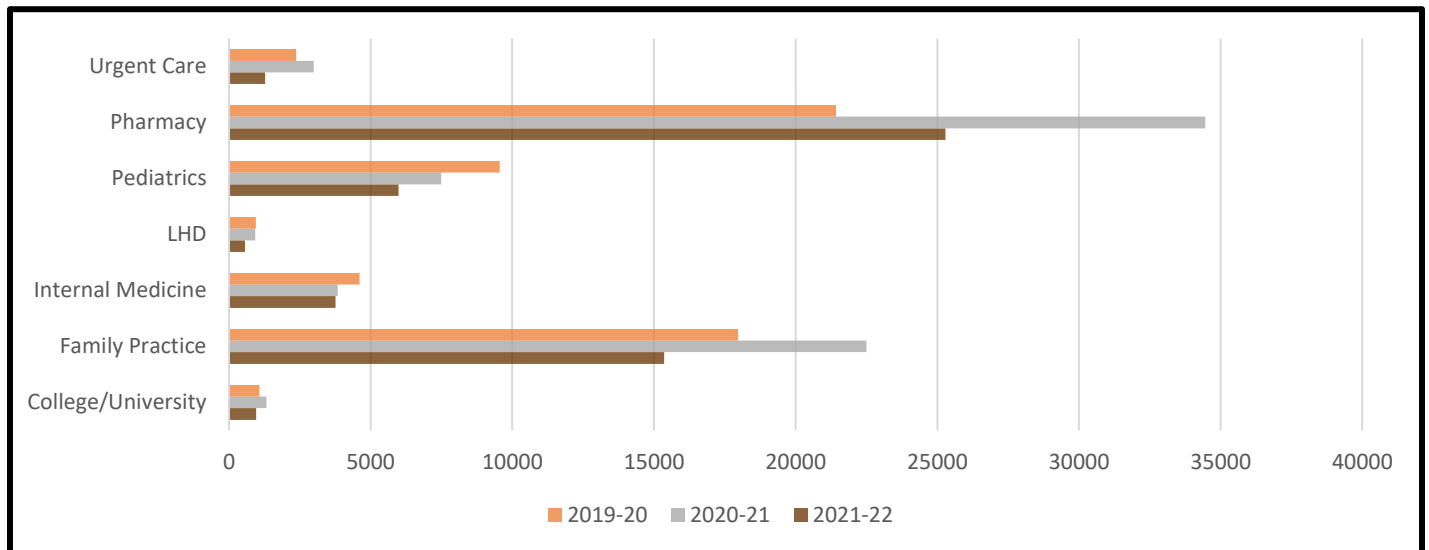
In the previous two flu seasons, the largest number of vaccines were administered to county residents during October. The number of vaccines administered monthly decreased for the remainder of the season.
