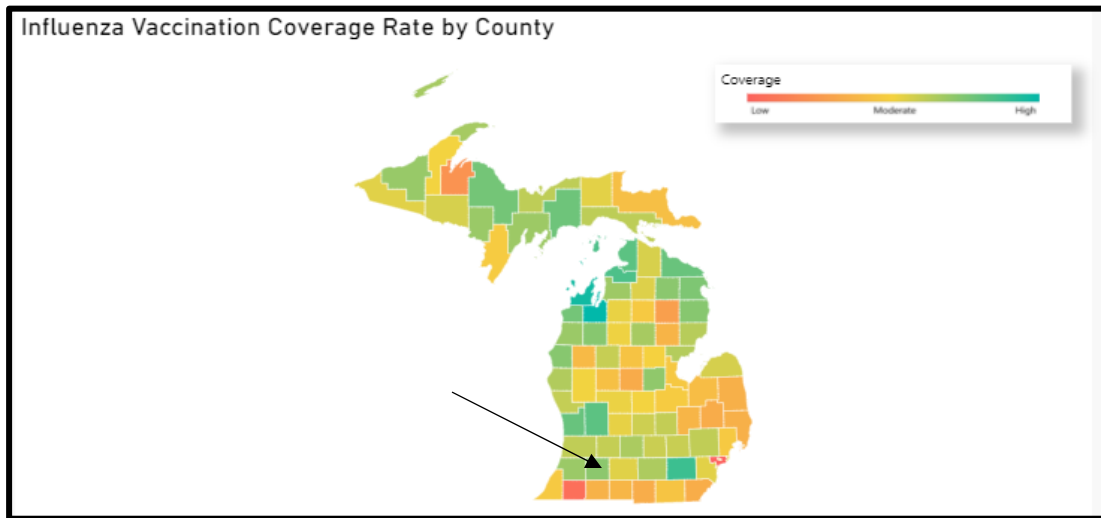


Coverage by County

During the last Influenza Season (2020-21), 40.4% of Kalamazoo County residents received a flu vaccine; this was higher than state rate of 34%. The map below shows the vaccination coverage rate by county for the 2020-21 Influenza Season, a darker green color indicates a higher vaccination rate. The highest county vaccination rate in the state was Grand Traverse County (50.22%) followed by Leelanau County at 49% (see table below). 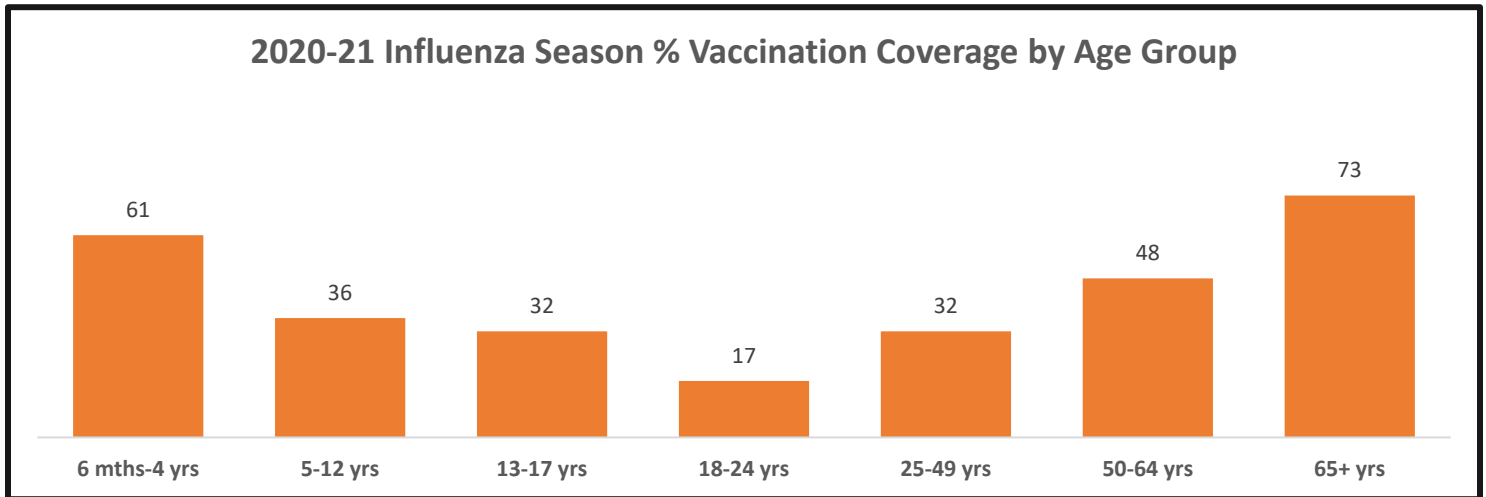

Coverage by Age Group

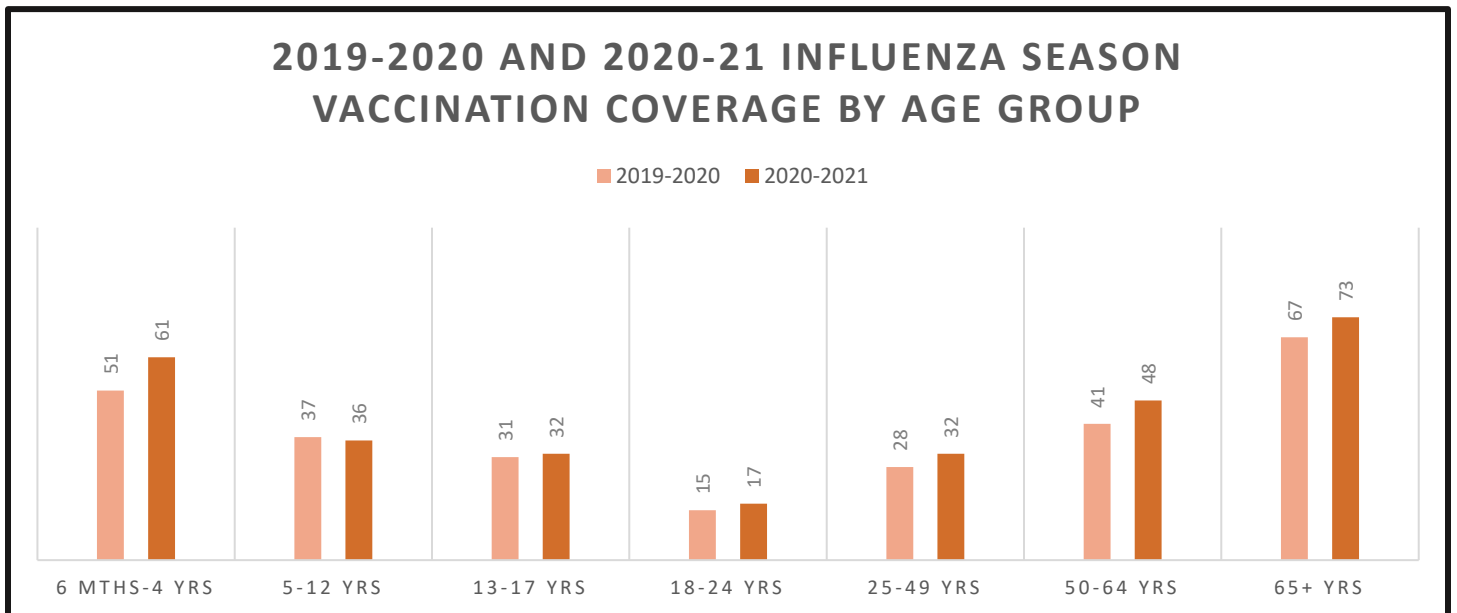
For the 2020-21 Influenza Season, the Kalamazoo County coverage rate was highest among those age 65+ (73%) followed by the 6 month-4 year old age group (61%). The lowest coverage rate was in the 18-24 year old group (17.15%).

Coverage by Age Group by Season

During the 2020-21 Influenza Season, 40.39% of Kalamazoo County residents received a flu vaccine; this was higher than the county 2019-20 rate of 36.62%. The largest increases in the vaccination coverage rate between the two seasons were in the 6 month-4 year age group (51% to 61%) and the 65+ years age group (67% to 73%). Coverage rates between the two seasons were similar for the 5-24 year old age groups.
