2023 Rules & Guidelines

Introduction: Following are the Kalamazoo County Fair Council (Fair Council) Rules and Guidelines which regulate the Kalamazoo County Youth Fair (Fair). The Fair Council shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as are authorized by the statutes and laws of the State of Michigan under Public Act 11 of 1929, as amended, and by the Kalamazoo County Board of Commissioners. The goal of the Fair Council is to provide a quality, family-oriented fair that supports the 4-H youth as well as promotes and encourages the agricultural and tourism industries in Kalamazoo County.

Regarding these Rules and Guidelines, the Kalamazoo County Fair Council reserves the final and absolute right to interpret said rules and regulations and to settle all matters, questions, and differences resulting from these Rules and Guidelines. The Kalamazoo County Fair Council further reserves the right to amend, or to add to, or delete from these rules as it finds necessary. Updated Rules and Guidelines will be published each year, for that year, in the Kalamazoo County Fair Book (Fair Book).

These Rules & Guidelines were approved by the Kalamazoo County Fair Council at its January 25, 2023 meeting.

Section 1 – General Exhibition Rules

1. If an exhibitor disregards any of the rules or guidelines in this document, he/she forfeits all rights, and privileges without remedy.
2. Exhibitors are not permitted to sell articles or exhibits or place "For Sale" signs on exhibits before the close of the Fair.
3. After the arrival of articles for exhibit on the fairgrounds, Fair management will use diligence and prudence to ensure the safety of articles entered for exhibition or display. However under no circumstances will Fair management be responsible for loss, injury or damage by fire, lightning, wind or by any other means, to articles on exhibition or display. Fair management shall be held harmless by the exhibitors against all legal or other proceedings.
4. Exhibitors must place all exhibits under the direction of the superintendent in charge of the department that the exhibit is registered and entered in.

Section 2 – General Facility Rules

1. Dogs, except for leader dogs, are not permitted on the fairgrounds during Fair hours. Dogs are allowed inside the campgrounds, but must remain there throughout the duration of the Fair.
2. The Kalamazoo County Fair Council prohibits demonstrations, protests, unauthorized distribution of literature, and any other disruption of activities at the Fair. Violators will be removed from the fairgrounds.

Section 3 – Entries

ALL STILL PROJECT EXHIBITS MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED BY JULY 28, 2023.

1. Pre-registration for all entries in all departments must be made on official entry forms. Entry forms for Open Class are available at the Kalamazoo County Fair Office and online at www.kalamazooountyfair.com. All Open Class pre-registration forms must be received in the Fair Office by July 28, 2023. Entries will not be accepted after July 28.
2. All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner or the organization when not individually owned. Failure to observe this rule will disqualify the exhibit.
3. All exhibits must be of this season's growth or production, except as noted in some department classes listed in this Fair Book.
4. Only one entry per person per class is allowed.
5. There will be two categories for all of the departments in the open class still exhibits. "Youth" refers to exhibitors that are 18 years of age and younger. "Adult" refers to exhibitors that are 19 years of age and older.
6. 4-H exhibitors are not permitted to enter into the youth open class divisions. Parents of the 4-H exhibitors are welcome to enter into the adult open class exhibits.
7. **Exhibit Deadlines:** Exhibits must be delivered to the fairgrounds between 9:00am and 11:00am on Saturday, August 5, 2023.
8. **Exhibit Pick-up:** Exhibits are to be picked up after the completion of Fair on Sunday, August 13 between 9:00am and 12:00pm. Removal of exhibits prior to established times will result in an exhibitor's forfeiture of ribbons. Fair Management will not be responsible for articles left after release time.
9. The Fair administrative management reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered.

Section 4 — Judging

1. Judging will take place on Saturday August 5. An A, B, or C ribbon will be placed on each exhibit by the judge and the exhibits will be placed on display for the duration of the Fair.
2. No person will be permitted to interfere with the judge while he/she is performing his/her duty of examination.
3. The decision of the judge is final on all placing.

ADA Policy

The Kalamazoo County Youth Fair is ADA compliant. The Fair will make all reasonable efforts to accommodate special need exhibitors. Please contact the Kalamazoo County Youth Fair five working days in advance if special accommodations are requested. The Fair allows ADA compliant motorized and non-motorized mobility devices for reasonable and equitable access by persons with a disability who require use of such mobility devices.

OPEN CLASS STILL EXHIBITS

There will be two categories for all of the departments in the open class still exhibits. "Youth" refers to exhibitors that are 18 years of age and younger. "Adult" refers to exhibitors that are 19 years of age and older. Ribbons will be awarded for all open class still exhibits. 4-H exhibitors are not permitted to enter into the youth open class divisions. Parents of the 4-H exhibitors are welcome to enter into the adult open class exhibits. All Open Class Still Exhibit exhibitor pre-registration entry forms must be received in the Fair Office by 5:00pm, July 28, 2023. Entries will not be accepted after 5:00pm on July 28.

Still exhibits can be entered on Saturday August 5 from 9am to 11am. They will be judged with an A, B, or C ribbon on that day and then will be on display for the entire week Fair. Still exhibits may be picked up from 9am to 12pm on Sunday, August 13.
