

Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) Newsletter – September 2023

CSHCS is a secondary insurance program designed to support children with eligible chronic health conditions and their families. CSHCS is also available for adults with cystic fibrosis, sickle cell disease, and certain bleeding disorders. Call the office for more information at 269-373-5015.

ATTENTION: Meridian Health Plan Members

As of **January 1, 2024**, Bronson will no longer be "in-network" with the following Meridian Health Plan insurance:

- Meridian Health Plan Medicaid
- Meridian Health Plan MI Health Link (dual eligible)
- Meridian Health Plan WellCare Advantage

If you currently receive coverage through one of the plans listed above, it is recommended that you choose a new plan that ensures you are covered by insurance for care received at all Bronson locations (including primary and specialty care providers, outpatient centers and all four member hospitals: Bronson Methodist Hospital, Bronson Battle Creek Hospital, Bronson Lakeview Hospital and Bronson South Haven Hospital).

Alternative plans to Meridian Health Plan Medicaid that Bronson will accept are McLaren Medicaid, Priority Health Medicaid, and UnitedHealthcare Medicaid. We suggest that you double-check with your Bronson pediatric specialists to confirm which Medicaid Health Plans they will be participating with after January 1, 2024.
